

A Holy Hour will be celebrated in **St Paul's** on Wednesday night 13th October at 7.00pm. All welcome to attend.


The Prayers to St Joseph will be said after 10am Mass in St Paul's on Tuesday 12th, Wednesday 13th and Thursday 14th October.
