

PASTORAL VISITS TO THE SICK

Priests continue to be available to visit the seriously ill and bring the sacraments to them in most areas of the hospitals in spite of the pandemic. Visits are also possible to homes in extreme circumstances. If you or a loved one requires a priest urgently, please contact the parish office, or hospital switchboard (3833) 4444). If a priest is not admitted to the ward, he will pray on the phone with the sick person if possible. Chaplains are also routinely available to support hospital staff at the present time on the number above.

PARISH OFFICE

The Parish Office will re-open again to the public on Monday 20th July @10.00am.



We are limited to 80 people in St Peter's to ensure that we can safely practise socially distancing of 2 metres.

The Archbishop has extended the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass at this time and attendance at a weekday Mass will fulfil the Sunday obligation. Therefore, please, if possible, think of attending a weekday Mass. This would greatly reduce the expected congregation at the Sunday Masses.

As stated above, St Peter's is only allowed to accommodate 80 people. To facilitate the small numbers allowed, St Peter's Parish is divided into 9 areas (see over). Only the people in areas 7, 8 & 9 will be able to attend Mass on the 18th/19th July at the appointed times.

For the weekend Masses 18th/19th July, people living in area 7, 8, & 9 can contact the Parish Office on Tuesday 14th & Friday17th July from 10.00am -12.00 noon, to request one of the eighty places at the appointed Mass for your area. We are unable to accept requests for places at Mass prior to Tuesday morning as the secretary is on holiday.

A single request is limited to 2 persons from the one household. This is to enable as many parishioners as possible to be able to attend Mass. The above procedure will be repeated for each successive weekend.

This is far from ideal but we are living in most unusual times and we must obey social distancing regulations and sanitising of the Church. It is most important that people who are vulnerable or unwell, and especially those with any symptoms that might suggest Covid-19 infection, should stay at home and, if possible participate as now, via the webcam or radio. The same applies to those who have been in recent contact with someone who has the virus in accordance with public health advice.
