Dromore Diocese Strategic Working Group

Earlier this year, Bishop McAreavey shared his concerns on the future of Dromore Diocese. A Diocesan Strategic Working Group (DSWG) was set up to review the pastoral life of Dromore Diocese during this time of profound change. The Group have met in September & October and expectations are they will remain as a working group until summer 2018. Currently the group are in the research phase of the work, which involves discussion, prayer, continuous engagement with the Clergy, listening and reflection. They have secured the assistance of Mr Bobby Moore, Organisational Development Facilitator to work with them in creating the Diocesan future plans to ensure we make vibrant and vital faith communities that are sustainable for the long run. The Group are planning to meet in December and an update will follow early in the New Year.
