NEW ARRANGEMENTS FOR SUNDAY MASSES
We now have had four weeks of Sunday Masses. The numbers attending have been well below our capacity level. The nine areas may have been too restrictive. We now propose to have six areas designated to specific dates and times. The advice to ring the parish office to request a place at Mass did not work, so that plan is now abolished. A family in a specific area may now attend their designated Mass.
The Archbishop continues to extend the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass at this time and attendance at a weekday Mass will fulfil the Sunday obligation. Therefore, please, if possible, think of attending a weekday Mass. This would greatly reduce the expected congregation at the Sunday Masses.

"I WAS SICK AND YOU VISITED ME"
HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY TO RESUME ROUTINE VISITS
On behalf of the Chaplaincy Teams across the Southern Trust, we are delighted to say that routine visitation of wards by chaplains will commence from Monday July 20th. Emergency on-call cover continued to remain in place throughout the Covid-19 pandemic and returning to wards for more routine visits is an important step forward at this time. As you can imagine, it will be a gradual and tentative re-engagement as we encounter the "new normal" in hospitals. It is a very changed environment into which we step. For example, given the visiting restrictions now in place, we will be avoiding visiting hours as only one nominated person can visit a patient at a time. While visits by the Chaplaincy Teams are permitted to resume, visits by parish clergy / ministers are not yet permitted by the Southern Trust in their hospitals. This is due to the strict limits on visitor numbers and infection prevention and control procedures. If a parishioner is in hospital and would like a visit from the Chaplaincy Team, please ask them to consent to the visit when asked by the nursing staff. Alternatively, a member of their family can ask the hospital to call us. You can always contact the hospital and ask to speak to the chaplain on call. On behalf of the Chaplaincy Teams across the Trust, we are deeply grateful for your support in so many ways. We know you join with us in continuing to pray in a special way for those who are sick at this time and those who care for them.
