1ST FEBRUARY - ST. BRIGID'S DAY

We celebrate the Feast of St. Brigid on Friday 1st February. She was born in 450 AD in Faughart, near Dundalk and lived during the time of St. Patrick. She was inspired by his preachings and became a Christian. When she learned that her beauty was the reason for the attentions of so many young men, she prayed fervently to God to take it from her. She wanted to belong to Him alone. God granted her prayer. Seeing that his daughter was no longer pretty, her father gladly agreed when Brigid asked to become a nun. She became the first Religious in Ireland and founded a convent so that other young girls might become Nuns. When she consecrated herself to God, a miracle happened. She became very beautiful again!

The crosses are made of rushes that are pulled rather than cut. They are hung by the door and in the rafters to protect the house from fire and evil.

Some parishioners have made St. Brigid's Crosses and they will be available before Masses this weekend.
