At this present time we have the capacity to accommodate 80 people within our Church. The following measures have been introduced for all

- Ushers will greet you at the church entrance and assign you a seat.
- Hand sanitizers are provided. It is necessary to use them at all times.
- You are invited to make an offering at the entrance to the Church there is a basket for offertory envelopes and donations can be given. Naturally, in the interest of safety collection baskets will not be passed around.
- Offertory envelopes and donations can also be left into the sacristy with Noel, or at the Parish Office
- At present holy water fonts are not in use.
- A one-way system is in operation with clear markings on the walls.
- All seats/pews are marked clearly to allow for social distancing.
- Families from the same household can sit together.
- To avoid the passing of speech droplets, there will be no congregational singing.
- The Eucharist is to be received at all times on our hands.
- Please note that all seats/pews are disinfected daily and after each
- Unfortunately, our toilet facilities have to remain closed.

Archbishop Eamon Martin, along with the other Christian church leaders all over this island, has formally recommended and encouraged the use of face coverings at all Masses and other liturgical celebrations, along with the on-going maintenance of 2 metre's physical distancing with immediate effect.

We apologise for the inconvenience and disruption that these changes bring about for all of us - but be aware that they have been introduced in line with government advice as very necessary measures to ensure our utmost safety and wellbeing.

#### Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel - Matthew 18:15-20

1 At the time Matthew was writing his gospel local church communities would have numbered no more than fifty people. They would be known to one another. Matthew presents the instructions of Jesus for dealing with people whose behaviour disrupted and harmed the community. Note the steps suggested. Simple directions but many of us do otherwise. We avoid difficult confrontations. We talk about the faults of others to everyone but themselves. We go over the head of someone who displeases us and make complaints. In your experience, which approach is life-giving for vou and for others?

- 2 While Jesus is referring to a group situation, the advice can be applied also to personal difficulties and problems with others. What lessons has life taught you about constructive ways of dealing with conflict?
- 3 As individuals and communities we have the power to bind and to loose, to exclude people from relationship, or to open up and include others in relationship. When have you found it important to acknowledge this power in your own life?
