#### **FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK** Wednesday 14th February **ASH WEDNESDAY**

Ash Wednesday is the doorway into our Lenten season of renewal - a day rich in associations and symbolism. It marks the beginning of Lent - a time for turning again to the practice of our faith, in prayer, selfdenial (fasting) and practical generosity (almsgiving).

Many Catholics consider it important to receive ashes on this day. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of a period of 40 days in which Catholics prepare for Easter. This period also represents the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert as well as the 40 years that the Israelites spent in exile. The ashes themselves come from the burned palms from last year's Palm Sunday celebration: thus bringing us full circle to our last celebration of the Passion. Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

On Ash Wednesday, we are reminded that we are called to turn away from sin, to repent and to believe the Good News of our salvation through Jesus Christ.

### Wednesday 14th February

Saint Valentine was a 3rd-century Roman saint, commemorated in Western Christianity on February 14 and in Eastern Orthodoxy on July 6. From the High Middle Ages, his Saints' Day has been associated with a tradition of courtly love. He is also a patron saint of Terni. epilepsy and beekeepers
