to coincide with the 100th Anniversary of Bishop Mulhern's consecration as Bishop of Dromore, a newly-researched lecture titled, "Bishop Edward Mulhern & his times: Sing a song to the Lord in a strange Land," will be given by the Society's chairman, Mr. Martin Goss, Newry.

The Society's Annual General Meeting will precede the lecture at 6.50 pm. Members' attendance at the A.G.M. will be helpful towards preparation for 2017, the Society's 40th Anniversary year.

Bishop Edward Mulhern's pivotal roles in the advancement of the Dromore Diocese, in the formalization of the status of the cathedral of Saints Patrick & Colman, and in the restoration of the Cathedral Chapter, were significant landmarks in his influential episcopate. The lecture will bring to mind the steadfast work and an array of the achievements of a noted Co. Fermanagh-born priest who came to this diocese in 1916 from his position as Parish Priest of Bundoran, Co. Donegal.

Dr. Mulhern died in August 1943, and his legacy lives on.

Notice From **Bishop John McAreavey**

Across the diocese of Dromore, people will be aware of a reduction in the number of priests available to serve in the parishes of the diocese. In 2005 there were 41 priests serving in parishes; today there are 23 diocesan priests, supported by 3 Polish priests and 3 Permanent Deacon. It is now essential to review the allocation of priests in the parishes of the diocese. Beginning in September, a process of consultation will be carried out,

involving clergy and parishioners. You will be kept informed about this process, as it evolves.
