### FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK

Sunday 14th January 2024 -We have been called by Christ to become children of God. How we respond is illustrated in today's readings. There is a seeking which develops into a search that leads to seeing and believing.

Monday 15th January 2024 - St Ita, Virgin Born in Co Waterford. She founded a monastery in Killeedy, Co Limerick which attracted a great variety of young people. She was given the title 'foster-mother of the saints of Ireland'. She died in 570.

Tuesday 16th January - St Fursa, Abbot and Missionary - Hebrews - Saint Fursa was an Irish monk who did much to establish Christianity throughout the British Isles and particularly in East Anglia.

Wednesday 17th January - St Anthony, died 356, Father of monasticism, lived a life of solitude but also attracted may others to form communities of hermits.

Thursday 18th January - Jesus brings healing to many afflicted.

Friday 19th January Relations between Christians call for every possible form of practical cooperation at all levels: pastoral, cultural and social, as well as that of witnessing to the Gospel message Unity of action leads to full unity of faith.

Saturday 20th January - Fabian, pope and martyr: had been Pope for fourteen years when martyred under Decius in the year 250

St Sebastian, martyr - may have been a soldier and was martyred in the persecution of Diocletian. He sustained many others in their trials
