

50th Anniversary of St. Paul's Church



This weekend, we are acknowledging the Fiftieth Anniversary of the solemn dedication of St Paul's Church. Plans for the new Church were drawn up in the early 1960s and work on the site was begun in 1962. The Foundation stone for St Paul's was put in place in 1963 and blessed by Bishop Eugene O'Doherty on Thursday 12th September that year. The new St Paul's was ready for use by December 1965 and Masses were celebrated for the first time on Sunday 19th December 1965, the Fourth Sunday of Advent that year.

With work on the Church finally complete, the ceremony of solemn dedication and 'official opening' of St Paul's was arranged for Sunday 17th April, 1966, which was the Sunday immediately following Easter, or 'Low Sunday' as it was then known. Cardinal William Conway presided at this ceremony, accompanied by Bishop O'Doherty, along with Bishop William Philbin of Down and Connor and Bishop Anthony McFeely of Raphoe. Once the Church had been dedicated, a Solemn Mass was offered with a large congregation and many clergy in attendance. Canon James Burke was the celebrant for this Mass. He was assisted at the altar by two deacons, Revd. Gerard McCrory and Revd. Rory McKee, both of whom would be ordained to the priesthood later that same year. All three clergymen were natives of Lurgan.

The site on which St Paul's Church is built was known locally as 'Celtic Park'. Lurgan Celtic F.C. played there in the early years of the last century and, in later decades, the park was a popular location for greyhound racing. Long the property of the Donnelly family of Church Place, it was bequeathed to the Parish of Shankill by Miss Emile Piche Donnelly, on her death in April 1959. A small memorial stone has been put in place, just to the right of the main entrance of the Church, to acknowledge the late Miss Donnelly and her generous bequest of this site.

We welcome Bishop McAreavey as the principal celebrant of the 12noon Mass in St Paul's today as we mark - to the very day - the fiftieth anniversary of the solemn dedication of our Church. We welcome clergy previously associated with St Paul's who are also joining with us for this Mass.

We give thanks, at this time, for the gift that St Paul's Church has been for local people, and for all who have been part of Catholic life in Lurgan, during the past five decades.
