

Tuesday 19th March - Feast of Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin

Mary - The virtues of St Joseph have been the object of ecclesial reflection down through the centuries, especially the more recent centuries. Among those virtues the following stand out: faith, with which he fully accepted God's salvific plan; prompt and silent obedience to the will, of God; love for and fulfillment of the law, true piety, fortitude in time of trial, chaste love for the Blessed Virgin Mary, a dutiful exercise of his paternal authority and fruitful reticence.

Thursday 21st March - St Enda - is considered to be one of the three great late vocations of Ireland. His siter, Faenche, a nun, set his thoughts on a religious vocation. He made a small foundation in Cill Aine, Co Lough and after studies in Scotland under Ninian, made several foundations in Boyne Valley.

Friday 22nd March - St Macartan -

Belongs to a very early generation of saints in Ireland and is recognized as the first Bishop of Clogher. He is known as Patrick's 'Strong Man' for his dedication and faithfulness.
