FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK 1ST WEEK OF LENT

Monday 19th **February** - The Gospel reminds us that Jesus came to preach good news to the poor. At the beginning of Lent we again get a reminder that good works are essential to our proper observance of the season, along with prayer and fasting.

Tuesday 20th February - The model of our prayer is the Lord's prayer. It is a summary of the whole Gospel, the most perfect of all prayers, Being taught and given to us by our Lord it is indeed the Word of God that goes out and succeeds in what it was sent to do. It is the foundation of the daily prayer of all Christians

Wednesday 21st February – St Peter Damian, Bishop and doctor of the

Church: gave up teaching to become a hermit. Later he was Cardinal Bishop of Ostia. He was an outstanding reformer of Church life and discipline.

Thursday 22nd February – The Chair of

St Peter, Apostle - This ancient feast relates to early Roman custom at this time of year of remembering the ancestors of the family, those who presided over the family fortunes. The feast celebrates Peter as bishop of Rom and the focus of unity in the communion of one faith.

Friday 23rd February – St Polycarp,

Bishop and martyr: Was bishop of Smyrna or Izmir in modern Turkey. Born around the year 69, he was a disciple of St John the Apostle. He was martyred in 155.

FORMS OF FRIDAY PENANCE FOR

The following are suggested as ways of fulfilling Friday Penance:

- Abstaining from meat or some other foods;
- Abstaining from alcoholic drink or smoking:
- Making a special effort at involvement in family prayer;
- Making a special effort to participate in Mass on Fridays;
- Visiting the Blessed Sacrament;
- Making the Stations of the Cross;
- Fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved to the needy;
- Helping the poor, sick, old or lonely
