

Celebrating the 50th Anniversary of St Paul's Church

A gathering to recall the building, dedication and beginning of the life of St Paul's Church, fifty years ago, will take place in the Church on Monday evening, 27th June, beginning at 7.30pm.

This event is being organised by the Dromore Diocesan Historical Society.

All Parishioners and friends of St. Paul's are warmly welcome.

This event will be both prayerful and informative with parishioners being involved on the evening.

Morning Prayer in St Paul's Church

Morning Prayer, from the 'Divine Office' will be recited publicly in St Paul's Church on Monday and Wednesdays at 9.40am.

Morning Prayer is considered, along with Evening Prayer, to be one of the great 'hinges' of the Church's daily prayer. It is intended to sanctify the beginning of our day and in the text for Morning Prayer we see certain themes recurring such as praise of creation, thanks for the gift of light, appreciation of the new day and a commending to God of the work and duties which lie ahead.

After a brief introduction and hymn, Morning Prayer, like all of the daily 'offices' draws upon the psalms of the Old Testament. Two psalms are prayed in Morning Prayer, with a 'canticle' placed between them. The canticle is a piece of scripture, arranged in verse form, which offers thanks and praise to God. At Morning Prayer, the scripture on which the canticle is based is drawn from the Old Testament. When Morning Prayer is offered publicly, the verses of the psalms and the canticle are usually alternated between two 'halves' of the congregation, or two 'sides' of the Church. Those present sit for the psalms and canticle. A short Scripture Reading follows the praying of the psalms and canticle, to which the congregation makes a common response. The Canticle of Zechariah, or 'Benedictus' is then introduced. It is proclaimed by all present, who stand from this point onwards, 'Benedictus' is Latin for 'Blessed' and this text begins with the words 'Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel'. They are words of praise offered to God by John the Baptist's father, Zechariah, on the return of his gift of speech, as recorded in the opening chapter of St Luke's gospel.

Following the Benedictus, there are a number of prayers of Intercession, to which the congregation are invited to respond. These intercessions culminate in the Lord's Prayer, after which the leader offers a Concluding Prayer.

Books containing the texts for Morning Prayer will be available in St Paul's every Monday and Wednesday morning.
