

# 150 Years Of Wonderful Service

This weekend we are celebrating, in a special way, the presence of the Sisters of Mercy in Lurgan for 150 years.

A group of Sisters first came here on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> August 1866 – the day which marked, across the Atlantic, the formal ending of the American Civil War. In times very different to our own, the Sisters set about their work with energy and fervour, opening their first schools just three weeks later, on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> September. The story of their service to Lurgan, across the generations which followed, has been a rich and noble one. We pause to acknowledge this and to give thanks to God for it, at this time.

Bishop McAreavey is celebrating the 6 pm Vigil Mass in St. Peter's Church, this weekend, as a Mass Of Thanksgiving. Refreshments are being served afterwards in St. Peter's Hall and Sr. Evelyn Kenny, archivist of the Mercy Congregation, will deliver a brief lecture there, summarizing the story of the Sisters in Lurgan since 1866

# <u>Dromore Diocesan Historical Society</u> <u>Sunday</u>, 28<sup>th</sup> August.

A commemorative field-trip to the grave in Desertcreat, Co. Tyrone, of Bishop Patrick Donnelly, formerly Bishop of Dromore, the 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of whose death occurs this year.

Often referred to as 'The Bard of Armagh,' on account of him travelling around great areas of this land in disguise during the harsh Penal Era, Bishop Donnelly was an heroic priest who carried out his Episcopal and priestly duties in the face of constant persecution.

The field-trip, (a lecture, a discussion and a song), will be lead by Tom Keane of Lislea, South Armagh, and will begin in Desertcreat Church of Ireland graveyard at 3 pm.

Bishop Donnelly's brother, Bishop Terence Donnelly, formerly Bishop of Derry, lies in the same grave in this their native place. This event is open to all parishioners as are all events organised by the Society. Jim Conway, Lurgan, committee member, has prepared a good map that will guide all travelling to Desertcreat. Reverend David Bell, Church of Ireland rector, is making his new parish hall available to all who might wish to bring a packed lunch for the offerneon.

Lurgan cars travelling to Desertcreat will leave St. Paul's Church car-park at 1.45pm. Car-sharing would be appropriate, and some 'spare seats' will be available.
