

## The Feast Of The Twelve Candles & Other Irish Christmas Customs



With a candle for each day since the passing of Christmas, the candles were lit in a circle and the family recited the Rosary whilst kneeling around the flickering flames.

Afterwards, guests were entertained by dancing a jig over crossed belts or willow patterned dishes placed in a four leafed shamrock form on the floor. A scooped out turnip, attractively decorated with frills and evergreens was used to hold the Christmas candle. This was lit by the man of the house on Christmas Eve.

In Kerry, the rule was that a man named John or a woman named Mary had to light it, after a blessing in the name of the Holy Trinity. In country cottages big white tallow candles were carried to the windows so that Mary and Joseph would know that a welcome awaited them inside.

### The Very First Christmas Gift-Givers



The original Christmas gift-givers were the Three Wise Men.

According to legend, Caspar brought the gift of Myrrh, a rare and highly treasured commodity in Biblical times. It is an aromatic gum resin which comes from the bark of a small desert tree known as Commifera Myrrha, of the dindin tree. This substance congeals into small pieces which are then ground into powder to make ointments or perfumes.

Balthasar, the black king from Ethiopia, presented a gift of Frankincense, another sweet smelling resin from a species of Boswellia trees which were to be found in India, Arabia and Ethiopia at the time of the birth of Christ. This valuable commodity was burned by the Romans on their altars. Melchior, the third wise king, brought a gift of gold. Nowadays, the person who delivers the Christmas presents is, of course, *Santa Claus*.
