Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin.

COVID-19 UPDATE

As of last Friday, our church doors are open again for parishioners to visit for *solitary* prayer. No group prayer or activities are permitted, but the peace and tranquillity of time alone with the Lord are an oasis at the present time.

We have put in place the necessary sanitary measures to make it safe for everyone, and ask the public to observe some simple measures in the churches to limit the spread of Covid-19 during your visit.

- * Follow the one-way route while moving around the church as indicated
- * Keep a distance of 2 metres (6 feet) from other people who are not part of your household, including when seated in pews.
- * Use sanitiser and wipes provided where indicated.
- * Do not touch any surfaces unnecessarily.

Those who are at increased risk from the virus and/or have been advised to shield themselves are also strongly advised to remain at home.
