Monday 4th March - St Casimir is the patron of Poland. He strove to promote peace and the unity of Westen Europe. Though a young price, he chose a life of prayer and penance.

Tuesday 5th March - St Kieran,

Bishop - Kieran of Saigir was born in Cape Clear. Co Cork. He is numbered among the pre-Patrician Saints of Ireland. He went to the continent where he was baptized and later ordained priest and bishop.

Wednesday 6th March The Law is a great treasure to be safely guarded and to be handed on as a sacred trust. In the new Jerusalem, the Church, the laws of Christ are not to be seen as burdens or out of date. They are the evidence of the love of Christ

Thursday 7th March -- Ss Perpetua and Felicity St Perpetua and St Felicity are

saints numbered among the Christian martyrs Perpetua, a young upper-class married woman and St Felicity, a slave girl, were martyred in Carthage 203.

St Senan was born near Kilrush Co Clare. His family were prosperous farmers. His vocation seems to have resulted from an experience of danger from the sea. He was anamchara to Ciaran of Clonmacnoise and Brendan. He died in 544.

Rome, lived a happily married life and founded a society of women with the Rule of St Benedict and became a member of it after her husband's death
