The most famous member of the family is the daughter known as the Little Flower, St Thérèse of the Child Jesus. Her parents, Saints Louis and Zélie Martin, were also canonised in 2015, and the relics of all three are travelling together to selected locations in Ireland in preparation for the WMOF.

Ss Louis and Zélie are patron saints of the World Meeting.

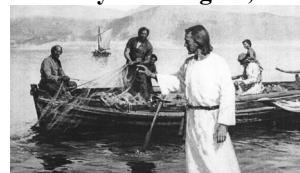

The Ring Finger - Our weakest finger, reminds you to pray for the weakest in society, like those who are sick, poor or having problems.

The Little Finger - The smallest finger reminds you to pray for yourself. When you have prayed for the other four groups, The smallest finger reminds you to pray for yourself.
