

Dromore Diocesan Historical Society Sunday, 28th August.

A commemorative field-trip to the grave in Desertcreat, Co. Tyrone, of Bishop Patrick Donnelly, formerly Bishop of Dromore, the 300th Anniversary of whose death occurs this year.

Often referred to as 'The Bard of Armagh,' on account of him travelling around great areas of this land in disguise during the harsh Penal Era, Bishop Donnelly was an heroic priest who carried out his Episcopal and priestly duties in the face of constant persecution. The field-trip, (a lecture, a discussion and a song), will be lead by

Tom Keane of Lislea, South Armagh, and will begin in Desertcreat Church of Ireland graveyard at 3 pm. Bishop Donnelly's brother, Bishop Terence Donnelly, formerly Bishop of Derry, lies in the same grave in this their native place. This event is open to all parishioners as are all events organised by

the Society. Jim Conway, Lurgan, committee member, has prepared a good map that will guide all travelling to Desertcreat. Reverend David Bell, Church of Ireland rector, is making his new parish hall available to all who might wish to bring a packed lunch for the afternoon.
