FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK

Sunday 8st January 2023 - The Baptism of the Lord - Jesus is anointed with the Spirit and his power. He is proclaimed Messiah. He now goes about doing good working the signs that make him known as the Servan to God. He is the one who brings good news to the poor and tells of salvation. Through our baptism each one of us is ordered to the life of Christ - Priest, Prophet and King - and the Father looks on us with favour.

Monday 9th January 2023 - The letter to the Hebrews is to be understood as a homily. rather than a letter. Just as for the people of his time so for us today the message of forgiveness, the call to courage and to hope, the challenge to risk are relevant. For God has spoken in his Son to us today.

Tuesday 10th January - Hebrews - The humanity of Jesus is strongly stressed: He is immersed in our human existence. Like us he suffered and was tempted.

Wednesday 11th January - Hebrews -Jesus is the pioneer of our salvation, the one who leads us forward into a new land.

Thursday 12th January - Hebrews: Let us not be foolish and reject the word spoken to us today, and in turn lose our own entrance into God's presence, into the Promised

Friday 13th January - St Hilary, bishop and doctor of the Church - Was elected bishop of Potiers and distinguished himself by his stand against Arianism. In exile (356-59) by order of Emperor Constantius he used his time to write. His major works include De Trinitate, as study of the Trinity.

Hebrews: The temptation to give up, to disregard the word of God, to take his gifts lightly - these are dangers for Christians at

Saturday 14th January - Blessed Virgin Mary. Hebrews: - We stand before God's judgement with Jesus who feels for our weaknesses.
