

### Our Mother of Perpetual Help 150th Jubilee Pilgrimage



The Icon, or image, of Our Mother of Perpetual Help (which is of eastern origin) was entrusted by Pope Pius IX to the care of the Redemptorist Order in 1865. The Pope requested that they would 'make her known' throughout the western world in the decades which followed. An early copy of this image was brought to Ireland by the Redemptorists the following year. In the later decades of the 19<sup>th</sup> century and early decades of the last century, the Redemptorists promoted this image of Our Lady and encouraged devotion to her through it. Often this was done through parish missions, which the Redemptorists delivered across the country. The existence of copies of this image of Our Mother of Perpetual Help in so many Irish homes, and the tradition of novenas in her honour (as in this parish, in the weeks leading up to 8<sup>th</sup> December each year), owes much to the efforts of those Redemptorists in former generations.

Over recent weeks, the Irish Redemptorists have been travelling across Ireland with the particular image of Our Mother of Perpetual Help which their Order first brought to this country 150 years ago, in 1866. The image is visiting the Cathedrals of each diocese, as part of this Jubilee pilgrimage, and will arrive at Newry Cathedral this coming Tuesday evening (10th May). Bishop McAreavey will celebrate a Mass of Welcome in the Cathedral on Tuesday evening at 7.30pm. There will be a Healing Service at 9pm and a further Prayer Service at 11pm. The Cathedral will remain open all throughout Tuesday night and Wednesday morning to enable veneration of the image and personal prayer. All are welcome to the Cathedral during these hours and to any of the above services.

The image will travel from Newry to Belfast, early Wednesday afternoon (11<sup>th</sup> May), visiting St Gerard's Redemptorist Church, Antrim Road, St Peter's Cathedral and Clonard Monastery.
