## Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

1.John objected when a person,

who was not in their group, cast out demons in Jesus' name. Jesus himself had no problem with this. Jealousy can poison our outlook even when what is done by another is good. 'He/She is invading my patch.' Perhaps you have seen, in yourself or in others, the effect of jealousy and the contrasting positive effect of being able to rejoice that good is being done, irrespective of the person doing it.
