NEW ARRANGEMENTS RE: WEEKDAY & SUNDAY MASSES

We have been given permission to begin public Masses on weekdays, beginning Monday 29th June and Sunday Masses beginning the weekend $4^{th}/5^{th}$ July.

We are limited to 80 people in St Peter's to ensure that we can safely practise socially distancing of 2 metres. This is a big enough logistical problem without the added burden of now only having three priests in the two parishes, instead of the four. Fr Fitzpatrick has been appointed Administrator of the neighbouring parishes of Moyraverty and Seagoe. Consequently, we have no option but to reduce Masses in both parishes. The 12.00 noon Mass in St Paul's and the 10.00am Mass in St Peter's on Sunday's will now be discontinued from Sunday 5th July. In St Peter's, the Polish Mass will come forward to 10,00am. It would have been impossible to clean the Church in St Peter's when the original schedule was 10.00am followed by the Polish Mass @ 11.00am followed by the 12.15pm. I hope you understand.

Currently, the weekday schedule of 10.30am Mass on Mondays & Wednesdays will be discontinued from Monday 29th June. There is a 8.00am Mass each day in St Peter's excluding Saturday and the evening Masses at 7.00pm on Tuesdays & Fridays will continue as normal. The Saturday morning Mass in St Peter's at 9.30am and the 10.30am in St Paul's will continue. The 10.00am Mass in St Paul's Monday - Friday will also continue. The Archbishop has extended the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass at this time and attendance at a weekday Mass will fulfil the Sunday obligation. Therefore, please, if possible, think of attending a weekday Mass. This would greatly reduce the expected congregation at the Sunday Masses.

As stated above, St Peter's is only allowed to accommodate 80 people. To facilitate the small numbers allowed, St Peter's Parish is divided into 9 areas (see over). Only the people in areas 1, 2 & 3 will be able to attend Mass on the 4th/5th July at the appointed times. Then areas 4, 5 & 6 on 11th/12th July and the final three areas 7, 8 & 9 on the 18th/19th July, at the appointed times.

For the weekend Masses 4th/5th July, people living in area 1, 2, & 3 can contact the Parish Office from Monday 29th June – Wednesday 1st July during office hours to request one of the eighty places at the appointed Mass for your area. We are unable to accept requests for places at Mass prior to Monday morning. A single request is limited to 2 persons from the one household. This is to enable as many parishioners as possible to be able to attend Mass. The above procedure will be repeated for each successive weekend.

This is far from ideal but we are living in most unusual times and we must obey social distancing regulations and sanitising of the Church. It is most important that people who are vulnerable or unwell, and especially those with any symptoms that might suggest Covid-19 infection, should stay at home and, if possible participate as now, via the webcam or radio. The same applies to those who have been in recent contact with someone who has the virus in accordance with public health advice.

My thanks to the members of the sub-committee of the Pastoral Council for their invaluable help and experience in helping to form the new arrangements.
