SIMNEL CAKE




The fruit cake made for the fourth and middle Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday, was called simnel cake in medieval times, when servants visited their

mothers and people visited the cathedral or mother church of the diocese. It becomes associated

with Easter. Lighter than Christmas pudding, it has plenty of dried fruit and layers of marzipan. It is made from the finest and whitest flour, called

simila, giving it its name. On top are eleven marzipan balls, representing the apostles (minus Judas) or twelve for Christ and the eleven.
