FEAST DAYS

Saint Martin (Monday 11th November) was the third Bishop of Tours, France. He became one of the most familiar and recognizable Christian saints in Western tradition. establishing a monastery at Ligugé. The Catholic Church distinguishes him as one of the 36 Doctors of the Church. He is the patron of France, soldiers, beggars and innkeepers.

Saint Josaphat (Tuesday 12th November) worked for the reunion of Ukrainian Catholics and was martyred in 1623. The Catholic Church distinguishes him as one of the 36 Doctors of the Church.

Saint Laurence (Thursday 14th November) was Archbishop of Dublin at the time of the Norman invasion of Ireland. He played a prominent role in the Irish Church Reform Movement of the 12th century, and mediated between the parties during and after the invasion.

Saint Albert (Friday 15th November) was a German Dominican friar, theologian and bishop. The Catholic Church distinguishes him as one of the 36 Doctors of the Church. He is the patron of scientists.
