TWO SMALL THOUGHTS

On a warm sunny afternoon, a group of workmen began to discuss good and bad memories. As a result of their discussion, a wager was set as to who could remember a poem or a prayer and recite it word for word. A young apprentice stood up and began to recite the 23rd psalm that he had learned some years before at School. As everyone listened, they realised that he had obviously received training in drama, in breathing techniques and in diction. Such was his delivery of the prayer that he recited it a second and third time to thunderous applause. The second man to take part was elderly and stooped, and at times it was even difficult to hear him speaking. As he stood in the corner he recited, 'The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. When he had finished there was total silence as each man bowed his head and began to pray quietly to himself. The young apprentice came over to the old man and shook his hand. 'It is fairly obvious that I know the psalm' he said, 'but more obvious that you know the shepherd.' **How many of us really know Christ?**

An evangelist was preaching to a large crowd of people who were gathered all around him. The evangelist pointed to a huge waterfall in the distance that had a tightrope going across it. He invited the crowd to follow him to the edge of the water and asked them, 'Do you believe that with God's help I can walk across this waterfall?' The crowd all cheered, 'We believe, we believe,' and as the evangelist walked across and back the people clapped and sang aloud, 'Praise God, praise God.' The evangelist had two strong men pass him up a wheelbarrow which he balanced on the tightrope, and he shouted out to the crowd, 'Do you believe that with God's help I can walk across this waterfall wheeling this old barrow?' The crowd once again cheered, 'We believe, we believe,' and as he moved across the water's edge the people raised their hands in the air with great joy and they praised God at the top of their voices. Finally, the evangelist asked the crowd, 'Do you believe that with God's help I can walk across this waterfall wheeling this old barrow with a person sitting inside of it?' The crowd became fanatical and they shouted repeatedly, 'We believe, Lord we believe!' The evangelist held his right hand in the air for silence and called out, 'Let the person who believes, jump in?' **For some strange reason there was no more cheering!**

The coming of Christ that we celebrate at Christmas brought light into a darkened world, 'a light that darkness could not overpower'. In the dark days of the pandemic, we can be bearers of that light, bringing it into the lives of those who may be living in the shadow of sickness, poverty, homelessness or isolation. We best express our thankfulness through personal thoughtfulness and kindness, and support given to organizations which do so much to help those in need. We urge people to respond generously to the Christmas appeals of Trócaire, Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, Crosscare and other charities which bring hope into the lives of many people.

As Christmas approaches, we keep especially in our thoughts those who have been bereaved in the past year, and we pray for the gifts of healing and hope for all.
