FEAST DAYS DURING THE WEEK

Monday 14th November - St Laurence O'Toole, Bishop - born in Castledermot, Co Kildare in 1123, he studied at Glendalough becoming a monk there and later its abbot in 1148. In 1162 he was chosen as the first native Archbishop of Dublin. He followed the reforming methods of Ceallach and Malachy, introducing the Canons Regular to minister in the cathedral, upholding the rights of the Church, caring for the people.

Tuesday 15th November - St Albert the Great, Bishop and doctor of the Church C 1206-80, the Dominican theologian, who taught in Cologne was called the 'Universal Doctor' for the vast range of his interests. Patrol of Scientists.

Wednesday 16th November: St Margaret of Scotland 1045-93, wife of Malcolm III King of Scotlad helped by her example and influence the work of reform in the Church.

St Gertrude: 1256-1302, a Benedictine num, from the age of five she cultivated devotion to the Sacred Heart and advocated frequent Communion

Thursday 17th November: St Elizabeth of Hungary - 1207-31, queen at fourteen, widowed and exited at twenty, Franciscan tertiary until her death at twenty-four. A woman of prayers and service of the poor

Friday 18th November - Dedication of the Basilicas of Ss Peter and Paul Martin of Tours, Bishop, - 316-97, Bishop of Tours, apostle of rural Gaul, founder of monasteries. Patron of France, soldiers, beggars and innkeepers.

Saturday 19th November: Blessed Virgin Mary The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place.


NOVEMBER MASS FOR THE DECEASED

THIS STORY IS DEDICATED TO ME AND ALL MY WONDERFUL CRACKPOT FRIENDS

An elderly Chinese woman had two large earthenware pots, each of them hung at the end of a pole which she carried across her shoulders.

The first pot had a small crack in it, while the second did not and always delivered a full portion of water. At the end of the long walk from the stream to the old woman's home, the cracked pot arrived only half full.

For many years she travelled back and forward to the stream on a daily basis, always bringing back only one and a half pots of water. Naturally enough the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments, but sadly the poor cracked pot was ashamed of what it saw as its imperfection, and was miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do.

After a long time of what it perceived to be bitter failure, the earthenware pot spoke to the old woman as it sat one day by the side of the stream. "I am ashamed of myself", it said, "this crack, this imperfection in my side causes me to leak water all the way back to your home." The old woman smiled serenely, "Did you notice that there are flowers on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? Well, that's because I have always known about this little flaw, as you call it, so I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we journey back to our home, you water them. For years now I have been able to pick all these beautiful flowers to decorate my table. Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace our home."

Each of us has our own unique, wonderful flaw. Remember that it's the cracks, the flaws and the imperfections that make our lives all the more human and often rewarding.
