FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK

25 December - Christmas Day

Monday 26th December - St Stephen First **Martyr** - Stephen was one of the first to follow the Apostles. It is believed that he was either Greek, or a Jew educated in Greek culture. What is certain is that he was greatly appreciated by the community in Jerusalem that his name appears first among the seven men chosen as deacons to assist the Apostles in their mission. A man "filled with faith and the Holy Spirit," we worked wonders and miracles. In the days following Pentecost, Stephen was hauled before the Sanhedrin, and accused by false witnesses of preaching that Jesus would "destroy this place and change the customs that Moses handed down to us."

Tuesday 27th December - St John, Apostle and evangelist John the Apostle or Saint John the Beloved was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Generally listed as the youngest apostle, son of Zebedee and Salome, his brother James was another of the Twelve **Apostles**

Wednesday 28th December - The Holy Innocents, martyrs - The Massacre of the Innocents is the incident described in the nativity narrative of the Gospel of Matthew in which Herod the Great, king of Judea, orders the execution of all male children under the age of two years in the vicinity of Bethlehem.

Thursday 29th December - St Thomas Becket, bishop and martyr - The murder of Archbishop Thomas Becket stunned the whole of Christendom. All across Europe he was acclaimed as a martyr, and in 1173 Pope Alexander III - who had never been unqualified in his support of Becket's position against the King - canonised him. Within ten years of his death 703 healing miracles had been recorded at his tomb.

Friday 30th December - the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph - The Holy Family consists of the Child Jesus, the Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph. The subject became popular in art from the 1490's.

Saturday 31st December - St Sylvester 1, pope - Pope Sylvester I was the bishop of Rome from 31 January 314 until his death. He filled the see of Rome at an important era in the history of the Western Church, yet very little is known about him.
