#### FUNERAL MASSES AND LITURGIES

From earliest times, our Church has honoured the dead and their memory with great respect. In the midst of this COVID-19 crisis we must never overlook families whose loved ones have died recently from other illnesses or in tragic circumstances. Like the relatives of the victims of COVID-19 they too have been unable to engage fully in the customary rituals that normally mark the death of a loved one. Restrictions have impacted our wakes, the gatherings of extended family and friends who can attend a funeral, and in some cases only a committal service attended by a small of mourners has been possible. We acknowledge the pain and hurt that families have endured, and we assure them of the consolation our prayer and our sympathy. As Saint Paul wrote to the Romans: "Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ".

Since the beginning of this pandemic we have rightly marked the personal sacrifices of our health workers, carers and many others who provide our essential services. We also recognise the dedication and service of priests, religious and lay people who selflessly reach out as hospital chaplains or in other parish ministry. Their pastoral care is bringing comfort and healing to those who are anxious because of a relative's illness or who are feeling the loss and pain of bereavement. Their commitment and dedication too is also greatly appreciated.

This pandemic, unfortunately, has not gone away and may likely be with us for the foreseeable future. In difficult times of the past our ancestors looked to their faith in Christ for light in the darkness, for hope against despair. We do so again, confident that Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and that God brings comfort to those who are anxious, healing to the sick and eternal rest and peace to the dead.

Current health protection regulations here in the north of Ireland have been made in response to the serious threat to public health which is posed by the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The regulations are intended to protect us, protect other people, reduce the spread of infection, and please God; finally bring the epidemic to an end. The current rules on how many people can attend a Funeral Mass or Liturgy state that a maximum of 25 people are permitted. We ask those attending the Church to wear a face mask or covering at all times. Procedures at present also state that there can't be any gatherings before or after a funeral.

**We sincerely apologize and understand that these restrictions will naturally bring about much sadness and hurt for those who are in mourning and who are preparing for the Funeral of a loved one, but are also very aware that they are legally enforceable. Overarching guidance on regulations and public health advice is available on the Department of Health website.**

**SVP Gift and Food Appeal** This year has been a most unusual year and one of great difficulty for a lot of households, so we hope to help as many families as we can with Christmas hampers and toys. We cannot put up notices, or a Giving Tree in the churches this year because of the safety regulations to keep the COVID - 19 virus at bay. So we are doing it virtually. From the **Giving Tree** we are asking for gift vouchers, toys and gifts for the children and adults. You do not have to wrap the gifts as it will be easier to identify the age group and gender of the persons for whom the gifts are intended. The age group that we find it most difficult to give to are boys and girls between the ages of 9 years and 15 years. Gift vouchers from the Rushmere Shopping Centre or Sports Shops are very helpful.

We are also collecting food items to make hampers. During the month of November we will collect these from the Churches as we did other years. We would like to have these collections completed by **the week of 13th December** so we can be sure we have enough of the needed items and gifts.

As always we so appreciate your generosity and support. We pray for you each time we meet. May you be blessed.
