

Friday 2 May - St Athanasius, bishop and doctor of the Church, Born at

Alexandria around 295, he fought ceaselessly against the Arian heresy, defending the true and equal divinity of Christ.

Apostles. St Philip asked to see and having seen he tells the good news to others. Formerly a disciple of John the Baptist he became a follower

St James - He converted many of the people of Jerusalem to the faith and was martyred in the year 62.

ST CATHERINE OF SIENA FEAST TUESDAY 29 APRIL 2025

St Catherine of Siena a 14th century mystic, theologian and Doctor of the Church, left behinds many propound and inspiring words. Here are three of her most famous quotes:

1. 'Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire' This quote emphasizes the importance of embracing one's unique purpose and -

calling, trusting that God's plan for each person is transformative and powerful. 'Nothing great is ever achieved without much enduring.'

St Catherine reminds us that perseverance and sacrifice are often necessary to accomplish meaningful and lasting good in the world.

3. If you are what you should be, you will set the whole world ablaze'. Similar to the first quote, this one encourages living authentically in accordance with God's will, highlighting the impact one person can have when full aligned with divine

Eternal God, eternal Trinity. You have made the Blood of Christ so precious through His sharing in Your Divine nature.

You are a mystery as deep as the sea; the more I search, the more I find, and the more I find, the more I search for You.

and I grow more famished for Your light. I desire above all to see You,

the true Light, as you really are. Amen.

The celebration Mass will be rescheduled to align with the new canonisation date.


A GAP YEAR WITH A DIFFERENCE!
